BREAKOUT CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

SPIRITUAL ENRICHMENT

Paula Briedis, Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor, Carenet Counseling, Wilmington, NC

Soul Rest: Rest. What a great word. Naps. Sitting on the beach. No phone calls. Rest means many different things to us. But did you know there's a type of rest only Jesus can offer? Not just any rest, but rest for your soul. In Matthew 11:28-30, Jesus clearly tells us how we can have true rest. Within this passage, we will explore the nuggets of truth about how to practice the kind He offers... Soul rest.

- NAMB Resources for Spiritual Enrichment and Growing Leaders for the Mission: We will explore the free resources the NAMB makes available to each Church and Association on the digital learning platform of Pathwright.
- The Vital Role of the Association in Southern Baptist Life: This will incorporate lessons learned over 30 years of associational ministry from a missionary perspective.
- God at Work In International Missions: Lessons learned from Ephesians 1 and an International Mission Board Missionary that coordinated the North Carolina Baptist & Southern Africa Baptist Partnership. This will include the vital role of prayer in Missions.

- How to Serve When You're Discouraged: There is no way to avoid discouragers! This is especially true if you worship at the church you serve. Adam and Eve had the Serpent, Moses had Pharaoh, and you've got your church family! This study will help you learn what the Bible says about dealing with discouragers in the church so you can continue to do your Good Work.
- How to Serve When You're Distracted: There is no way to avoid distractions! This is especially true if you worship at the church you serve. Sometimes we have to say no to the church in order to say yes to God. This study will help you learn what Jesus says about dealing with distractors in the church so you can continue to do your Good Work.
- How to Serve Under Pressure: There is no way to avoid stress! This study will help ministry leaders understand what stress is, where it comes from, and how to properly manage it. Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you."

 That means we already have what we need to calm our anxious minds!

- Church Communications 101: What is church communications and why does it matter? In this session you will learn some of the basics of good church communication as well as what you should always include as part of your church communications plan in order to improve your reach as a church.

Clear and effective church communication takes strategic effort. Join us as we walk through basic principles of design for a church context, and learn how to create visually appealing graphics for social media, websites, email and more.
- Graphic Design Using Canva: This session will resource and equip your church to better communicate with clarity and consistency. We will use Canva, a free online graphic design web application, to review best practices for design, while also honing your Canva technical skills so you can quickly and effectively communicate with your congregation and community.

Navigating Ministry Employment Compliance: Ever wonder if your church's workers are properly classified? An overview will be provided of the updated guidelines for correctly classifying workers including a review of recent changes to the independent contractor rules and employment salary thresholds. Common mistakes will be highlighted for you to have confidence in your compliance with these updated rules.

Hiring a Strong Ministry Team: Having trouble finding the right person for the job? Knowing the best practices for hiring staff are essential. Attention will be placed on effective strategies for attracting qualified candidates, conducting thorough interviews, and ensuring a fair and compliant selection process. Implementing these best practices can enhance your church's ability to build a strong and capable team.

Church Insurance 101: How a perfect storm has affected church insurance.

Girl Talk: This year we will look at issues we all might face (personal & work related). Possible topics of conversation include:

- ⇒ Tensions in the office when a staff member is not pulling their weight.
- ⇒ Thinking about retirement, passing the torch? What does that look like? (preparing church & personnel committee for your departure, does anyone really know all that I do?)
- ⇒ Personal issues (spouse, kids, aging parents) -how do I separate personal from my work? Or do I need to keep separate? How much is too much to share?
- ⇒ Health issues and needing extra time off from work ... whether it's me or my coworkers. Sharing the load.
- ⇒ Be clear on responsibilities. Work as a team without overstepping into coworker's responsibilities.
- ⇒ Struggles of being a caregiver for family
- ⇒ How to carve out personal time for yourself to just relax and rest
- ⇒ How do you handle Day to Day stressors in your family

Church Financial Policy Update: This session will review the importance of good financial policies and procedures. We will review some of the latest concerns as we have moved into an electronic era of giving and methods of payment, and some policies to address these issues.

Church Budgeting: Can someone look at your church budget and see the mission of your church? How well did your church respond to the impact of COVID? This session will explore the concepts of preparing a flexible budget to better meet the needs of your church. Also, we will discuss what a mission based budget looks like.

Finance Committees: What is the role of the Finance Committee? Many churches have a Finance Committee, but they don't seem to do very much. We will review the purpose of a Finance Committee and how they should be the oversight team for the church finances.

Personal Budgets and Other Financial Matters: For the past 10 years we have always discussed matters that impacted the church, now we are going to take some time to discuss financial matters that impact us today and in the future. We will look at preparing a family budget, preparing for retirement including a summary of Social Security, and applicable tax laws.

2024 Tax Update AND Q & A: We review some of the recent tax changes, including an update to the new FLSA, most asked questions of 2024 and a chance for you to ask that bothersome question that no one else will ask.
